Measuring Women's Work December 1 2014 to November 30 2017

We aim to improve the measurement of women's work as collected in survey instruments, particularly for the sub-Saharan African context. Qualitative work revealed to us that women think of work as one of the ways of upholding their role in the household and meeting the financial responsibilities associated with this role. In Burundi, we pilot a new survey instrument that nests work within a range of ways women gain financial resources.
